Lutheran Family Service is in the DAKOTAS!



For more than a century, Lutheran Family Service has been walking with people in times of need, providing support just as God has been there to support us. And now the opportunity to walk with those in North and South Dakota is officially here! Both the LCMS North and South Dakota Districts have invited Lutheran Family Service into ministry partnership, knowing our expertise in church worker wellness, pregnancy counseling and adoption, mental health counseling, marriage and family counseling, and grief education and support.

Lutheran Family Service operated almost solely in Iowa until several years ago when the South Dakota District – having heard about our hope-filled, Christ-centered counseling – called on Lutheran Family Service to assist in a crisis situation. From that first

interaction in South Dakota, LFS has continued to focus on helping our pastors and other church workers with all manner of challenges that arise in their ministry vocations.

Now this year, LFS is making headway into North Dakota. A list of vetted local Christian counselors is in the works, with LFS staff immediately available via remote telehealth

for anyone anywhere in North Dakota. Our northward-expanding services also include pursuit of a license to place children for adoption into Christian families. Please pray God sends us the right person to launch our adoption ministry in North Dakota!

Offering a Safe Haven

As a result of legislative efforts by Lutheran Family Service, private adoption agencies like LFS now have the ability to receive lowa infants through the Safe Haven Act. Branch offices in Urbandale, Fort Dodge, and Bettendorf are prepared to do so.

"We asked the Iowa Legislature to make this change for one simple reason, some women are afraid to go to the Department of Human Services, and that fear may prevent them from making a safe decision." says Kim Laube, Deputy Director of Lutheran Family Service. "Some women also believe their infant will wind up in 'the system' if they go through DHS for a safe haven relinquishment. By giving the option to relinquish to a private adoption agency, women may feel there is a more stable process for their child to bond with an adoptive family right away."

Since 2002, over 50 babies in Iowa have been relinquished through the Safe Haven Act.

What is Safe Haven Adoption?

Safe Haven relinquishments are different than traditional adoption because the birthparent has no obligation to give any identifying information for themselves or the child they are relinquishing. Many women find themselves in dangerous situations during an unexpected pregnancy, especially if there



are people in their life who are violent. Safe Haven relinquishments allow the birthmother, birthfather, or a designee to bring the child to a safe location and never reveal any information about themselves or the child without being prosecuted for abandonment.

Lutheran Family Service will bring all infants relinquished through Safe Haven to a medical professional for evaluation and treatment. While that is occurring, we will be calling our numerous adoptive families to line up a family to receive the child in adoption as quickly as possible. Many factors go into deciding who the adoptive parents will be, but our focus is always on the best interest of the child.

We Are Here
