Growing By God's Grace

New Counseling Office Extends Christ-Centered Care in South Dakota



The city of Aberdeen will soon be home to a new source of hope and healing. This fall, Lutheran Family Service is opening a new counseling office, bringing professional and Christ-centered support to individuals and families across northeast South Dakota.

A community outreach of the LCMS churches in South Dakota, LFS relies on the support of caring Christians — with no government funding — ensuring its service remains rooted in Christ.



The new office comes to Aberdeen through a

partnership with the Rural Gospel Initiative (RGI), a group of 14 LCMS congregations supporting regional outreach. Rev. Bret Bierman, pastor at St. John (Aberdeen), St. Paul (Stratford), and Trinity (Mansfield), and RGI board member, shared his enthusiasm for the partnership:

"Pastors wear many hats, but very few are trained counselors. There have been times in counseling sessions with someone when it was apparent that this person had needs beyond my skills. I've also had parents seeking help for their child and wanted a counselor who was based in true biblical understanding. The RGI sought to find ways to help, and we are able and excited to have LFS join us in Aberdeen. We look forward to a successful venture and pray for God's continued blessings and guidance."

The new office is located inside St. Paul's Lutheran Church in

downtown Aberdeen. Services available at the new location — and throughout South Dakota via telehealth — include professional mental health counseling, marriage and family support, pregnancy counseling, and adoption services; as well as seminars, support groups, and online resources.

With existing locations in Sioux Falls, Deadwood, and Rapid City, LFS adds the Aberdeen office to its network, further expanding care across South Dakota.

Dreena Wertz will be serving the new Aberdeen office. With degrees from Northern State and South Dakota State Universities, Dreena works with a wide variety of issues and served at a community mental health center prior to LFS.

"I enjoy being able to walk alongside people and give them hope as they navigate life's struggles. This partnership with RGI provides a connection with pastors and the community, and I look forward to seeing how God works through me and this ministry at LFS."

Welcoming Faith Muehler and introducing *RISE Together* School Counseling

Children in schools today carry more than just backpacks and pencils. Many walk into classrooms carrying invisible burdens. These burdens could be anxiety about home life, pressure from peers, confusion about their emotions, or spiritual questions that bring doubt or confusion. Together with you, we care deeply about their well-being; and that of their parents, teachers, and pastors.

At God's leading, Lutheran schools sought partnership to better serve students, parents, and staff. Through LFS, a called Deaconess now walks alongside Trinity, Cedar Rapids, and Central Lutheran, Newhall — bringing care and encouragement to their school communities.

Deaconess Faith Muehler was installed into this new position by pastors Daryn Bahn and Ted Groth on August 17 at Trinity, Cedar Rapids.






Deaconess Faith, a recent graduate of Concordia University Chicago, is already developing the relationships God will use to carry out this ministry. She explains her call this way:

Trusting God's plan, Gia's adoption was ultimately finalized, and she was baptized shortly thereafter.



Della's parents, Josh and Jessica, have been over-whelmed with gratitude for the way God lovingly prepared their hearts long before they even understood why. "To finalize Della's adoption is to witness God's faithfulness in action. It's not just a legal milestone, but a reflection of the seeds He planted long ago, and how He gently brought them to life in His perfect timing."

Madelyn began her life as a cryogenically-frozen embryo years ago. She was just recently born to her new parents through our embryo adoption program, designed to help match adopting families with parents who donated remaining embryos following successful IVF (in vitro fertilization). Madelyn is a healthy baby girl, deeply loved and fully cherished by her parents, Scott and Melanie.



Emmett's birthmother started working with LFS shortly after she learned she was pregnant. The placement did not play out as planned, thanks to an emergency C-section, a helicopter ride for Emmett to a larger hospital, and a 29-day stay in the NICU. Today there are no long-term concerns with Emmett's health, and he is happily growing and thriving in his loving, Christian home.
